We were thrilled to be back *in-person* at Brooklyn Botanic Garden again after 2 years of hosting Plant-O-Rama virtually on Zoom during the pandemic. During the course of the

Field Trips



March 5 - Philadelphia Flower Show – Andrew Bunting, VP of Horticulture for PHS, provided complimentary tickets for 32 MHG members and gave a personal introduction and welcome upon our arrival. MHG member and PHS judge, John Oakley Higgins, also met us and provided informative on how the competition side of things works. The scope of the Show was remarkable—show gardens, floral displays, plant societies, vendors, educational groups, etc.



May 25 - The High Line – Over 30 members attended the field trip led by Richard Hayden, Director of Horticulture at the High Line and MHG Board member. Beginning at the new Moynihan Connector, this new section incorporates many enhancements like deeper planting beds and wider walkways, as compared to earlier sections of the High Line. It also features a whimsical, 600-foot timber bridge that looks like it could have been constructed from a child's erector set. As we travelled south, Richard highlighted some of the modifications taking place, with guidance/input from Piet Oudolf, to adapt to changing conditions brought on by substantial new construction, increasing number of visitors, a maturing canopy, etc.

June 22 - Tibbets Brook Daylighting Project

Christina Taylor, Deputy Director of Van
 Cortlandt Park Alliance, provided an
 overview and walking tour of the Tibbetts
 Brook project for the approximately 20
 MHG members who attended. She explained
 how the current green infrastructure and
 storm-water management plans will
 significantly decrease the amount of sewer
 overflow that leaves Tibbetts Brook, and
 reduce flooding in neighboring homes. She
 also discussed their plans for the greenway
 extension and for improving public access to


