### **Field Trips:**

Three trips were held this past summer and fall:

- July 14 Swindler Cove Park and Sherman Creek
   Hosted by Jason Smith, NYRP, we learned about the Living
   Shoreline project, completed in 2020, which is intended to maintain and restore shoreline along the eastern edge of the park. Jason also pointed out numerous prized specimens in the woodland garden and we toured the formal vegetable gardens that are used for educational purposes.
- August 17 Kingsbridge Heights Community Center ("KHCC") – Hosted by the energetic and inspiring Gerry Sherman (Horticultural Therapist & Garden Program Coordinator) we began the evening with a brief presentation outdoors, surrounded by 20+ community garden plots, and later proceeded to the education areas in the back, which include vegetable gardens tended by high school interns, composting facilities, a plot of hot

peppers that are part of a community-based program for hot sauce



production, fruit tree areas and a bee hive area which produce over 300 pounds of local honey.

<u>September 9 - Madison Square Park</u> - Our very own Board Member, Stephanie Lucas, hosted us at the much-loved Madison Square Park, and shared "behind-the-scenes" information on Maya Lin's *Ghost Forest* installation and highlighted many specimens in the related exhibition on Plants of the Pine Barrens. Stephanie and her team also reminded us that park is a nationally accredited arboretum of over 300 trees.

### Membership:


We are happy to welcome 2 new board members:
